Travel

Please arrange your travel individually. The Mercure Ayr Hotel can easily be reached by air, train or car. Travel expenses will be reimbursed to group members and invited speakers by the chairman (economy fares only).

Access by air

There are flights by all major carriers to Glasgow International Airport (GLA). A regular bus transfer operates between Glasgow Airport (Stance 1) and the city centre, terminating at **Glasgow Buchanan Bus Station** (Stance 46). Stop number 2 for Bothwell Street at Hope Street is the best stop to connect for **Glasgow Central** Station. A single ticket costs £8.00 by cash or card, tickets can also be purchased in advance or by mobile phone app.

Access by train

There are 4 trains per hour from **Glasgow Central to Ayr** train station. The hotel is 0.5 km from the train station.

Access by car

From the airport, take the M8 towards Glasgow then follow signs for M77 Kilmarnock. Continue on the M77 towards Ayr then at the roundabout take the $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$ exit following A77 towards Ayr. Continue straight through 2 roundabouts. At the next roundabout take third exit onto A70/Holmston Road. Continue to Dalblair Road, Ayr, KA7 1UG .
